- III. To attend the training in full uniform.
- IV. To intimate Academy at least 48 hours in advance on Phone 079-27664601-15, Extension – 455, for availing accommodation at the Hostel of Academy, if required. The accommodation will be provided to the participant only and not before 24 hours from the reporting time.
- V. To follow all Covid-19 Protocols/Guidelines issued by Government/Hon'ble Gujarat High Court.
- VI. To submit detailed report containing following parameters directly to Principal Judicial Officer for perusal and guidance within 07 days after attending the training. Such report shall not be required to send to the Academy:
 - a) Introduction
 - b) Evaluation of Experience in detail, on each subject discussed during the training
 - c) Self-participation
 - d) Usefulness of the Course
 - e) General observations & suggestions
 - f) Conclusion
- VII. Considering the Evaluation Report, the Principal Judicial Officer shall take appropriate action as he/she thinks fit.
- VIII. The Judicial Officer shall normally avail Journey Period for the Distance between the Headquarter of Judicial Officer and Gujarat State Academy, Ahmedabad, as mentioned below:-

•	Less than 50 kms.	Not entitled for journey period
•	More than 50 kms. to 200 kms.	Half day journey period
•	More than 200 kms.	One day journey period
•	In case, if Holiday / Public Holiday occurs in the prefix / suffix, no Journey Period shall be admissible and Journey is to be performed in all the above cases on holiday.	

- X. No exemption shall be granted to any of the participant judges except in case of emergency which will be decided solely by the Registrar General of High Court of Gujarat based on cause and proofs attached with exemption request.
